

### CHURCH STRUCTURE

The Church of Scotland have been moving Church governance structures to a Unitary Model. This simply means you have a Kirk Session, no Church board, and have teams that support the work that is needed for us to serve each other and the community, for God, in an organised way, well that's the theory!!

The Kirk Session took some time last year to look at what this means for us, and we have come up with the following teams:

### Mission, Outreach and Communications

This covers social media, Communication, Newsletter, Web site Review, Connection with current groups/users, Leaflet Drop, Summer Mission, Develop Cluster Relationships, and Relationships with local schools.

### Worship

This covers Different styles/Types of hymns/Music, Better IT, Printed notices, Better Sound, Band, increase choir numbers, CCLI music licences, Varied Worship styles, Be open to new ways, Tea Squad, Welcome Squads, worship cover, and Rota of Readers

#### **Fabric**

This covers Building Grounds, Safety Check lists, Garden, Meter Reading, Access and Ongoing schedule of Maintenance.

### **Finance and Fundraising**

This covers Counts, Recordings Accounts, Gift aid, Donations, Events – social and fund raising, Source Funding, Knowledge of what available, Squads, Stewardship and Letting of Halls

### **Church Family and Pastoral**

This covers Family Contact for House bound, Elders visiting Organisation, Link person for groups who used church, follow up people baptised / children, Visiting and giving flowers, follow up after a funeral, Finding the talents of the church, Prayer chain, Prayer box, Information, Visit – House Bound/Hospital, newsletter delivery, Celebration Book, Prayer Requests, GDPR and Pastoral visit team.

## Dear Everyone at Carntyne and Cranhill Parish Church,

I'm grateful to your Minister, Rhona, for inviting me to contribute something to your church magazine. It hardly seems any time at all since the Service of Induction in June when we inducted and welcomed Rhona as Minister of this newly united congregation. It has been almost eight months though, believe it or not! I hope that during this time you have all begun to settle into your new identity and into new relationships as the people of God in Carntyne and Cranhill led by your not so new Minister!

I read recently there has been a poll carried out which shows that adults start behaving like their parents at age 43. Apparently, this means they begin to moan about the weather, fall asleep on the sofa during the evening and head to bed before 10pm. It is also at age 43 that they will have a favourite chair and take up gardening (but not both at the same time!)

I wonder if any of this sounds like you, whatever age you are?

And I wonder if you see any other things in yourself that remind you of your parents or those adults you grew up with?

Maybe it is the things you say or the things you like – or don't like; the routines you fall into or the choices you make about everything from clothes (comfort fitting and not so high heels); purchases in the supermarket or how you spend your leisure time.

All this led me to wondering about whether as the people of God and followers of our Lord Jesus Christ we show others the likeness of Christ. When others look at or listen to us; when they see the kind of lives we lead, the actions we take and the choices we make – do they see something of Christ in us?

I think that as Christian people this is something for which we should be striving. We are called to be Christ-like showing the love of God to others round about and to those further away. Of course, that's quite a challenge. It's not always easy.

However, the more we come together to look to and learn from Christ our Lord the more of a habit living Christ-like lives becomes for each of us. Being together in worship; joining in the fellowship of God's people and taking part in work and service together means that the way of Christ; something of the image of God rubs off on each of us – so perhaps even without fully realizing it we begin, at any age, to be like our Lord.

I'm so pleased that many of you in Carntyne and Cranhill are getting involved with the Glasgow Close Knit project and have already produced so many beautiful blankets. These will be distributed (after being displayed) by Lodging House Mission to individuals and families who need them to keep warm and who also need to know they are cared for and valued by us whose Lord, Jesus Christ, also loved and cared for the most vulnerable in society.

Well done to you all!

I understand knitting needles are still clicking away; crochet hooks are hard at work and sewers are being kept busy - so keep going!
Keep going too as you witness to the goodness, grace and love of God by being the church here, loving and serving in the name of Christ.

I'm sure that the more we all behave like Christ and the more we live like him, the more we, ourselves are blessed and the more we bring to others the blessing of God's love, joy and peace. 
The Moderator of Presbytery,

Rev Janet Mathieson, along with Rev Peter Gardener, Minister to The Visual Arts Community, and Deacon Claire Herbert, Chaplain to The Lodging House Mission, have invited everyone in Glasgow to take part in "Glasgow Close Knit" to show our care for others, as the finished blankets will be used to help the homeless in our community.

Our knitters at Carntyne and Cranhill Parish church have been joined by others, including our Community Cafe folk and ladies from the Hobbies and Crafts Group at Tron St Mary's Parish Church (Rhona's previous charge) and it's good to be working together with one aim: "In this way in its 850 Anniversary year we continue and mark the heritage of Glasgow as a

city that cares for all, supports the most vulnerable and knows all people in Glasgow and beyond are Knit Together in the love that is the gift of God to us." Presbytery, January 2025
All the finished blankets will be displayed as pieces of art in Glasgow and the surrounding areas from the middle of 2025, so we ask that all squares be handed in by the end of April to give us time to sew and finish our contributions.

### The Community Cafe

As I write this, I am back at the Guest House in Accra enjoying a two-week holiday with my



friend from the Borders and re-discovering the joys and convenience of living in the city. It has been a good time of relaxing and sight-seeing, with a lot of reflection and catching up. I should return to Sandema on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> February. My planned Home Assignment has been delayed until June and July so we can fit in more dry season trainings. I hope to be able to spend some time with you all in the Carntyne area.

I do thank the session at C&C for the personal gift they sent me which paid for my flight to Accra and the new picture for my living-room in Sandema. Christmas was busy. The Children's Ministry leaders from the four Sandema GNBC churches arranged a parade through the town and market on Christmas Eve, led by the youth brass band. On Christmas Day nearly 300 church children and their friends enjoyed a party at Town Church, with films, stories, singing, games, crafts and everyone's favourite meal, Jolof rice. It was a blessed Christmas!

The Good News Bible Church, which was started by SIM, had their Pastors and Leaders conference early in January. My neighbour and co-worker, Ps Nicholas was set-apart as the national Children's Ministry Co-Ordinator last year, and it was wonderful to see the network of children's ministry workers that has formed from all over Ghana within the year. I will use the money the church donated to extend our interdenominational training programmes into new areas in northern Ghana which we have identified.

Help me to listen well to what God has to say to me and the training team about the way forward in the children's ministry. We see several opportunities. Give thanks for local friends who help and keep me safe as I adjust to a new way of living in Sandema.
